Curriculum Implementation Support Program - CISP-III 23rd to 24th July 2024 Report

Curriculum Implementation Support Program - III (CISP-III) workshop was organized at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed to be University Medical College, Pune, on 23rd to 24th July 2024 in ME room, 3rd floor, college building.

It was organized under the aegis of Institute of Medical Technology & Teachers' Training (IMETTT), MUHS, Nashik. NMC appointed Observer Dr. Sandeep Sitaram Kadu, M.B.B.S, M.D(FMT), DNB(FMT), D.M.R.E, L.L.B, M.B.A, PGDHHM, PGDMLS, C.F.M.J., PhD(Scholar), FAIMER Fellow- 2022 Controller of Examinations, MUHS, Nashik.

Total 28 faculty members across the departments attended the workshop. Out of the 28 faculty members, 2 were from Preclinical subjects, 3 from Paraclinical subjects, 9 from Medicine & allied subjects and 14 from Surgery & allied subjects. Representation across hierarchy of seniority was 14 Professors, 8 Associate Professors and 6 Assistant Professors. All participants actively participated in the workshop, making the sessions fruitful and lively.

Workshop PPT presentations created by NMC and shared with us by the NMC Regional Center, Institute of Medical Technology & Teachers' Training (IMETTT), MUHS, Nashik helped us to get across to the participants the essence of various aspects of the new CBME Curriculum.

As far as prior knowledge is concerned, as two batches (2019-2020, 2020-2021) have already undergone new CBME curriculum; participants were familiar with some aspects of new CBME curriculum.

The sessions started from Goal, roles and associated competencies expected of an Indian Medical Graduate (IMG). They covered all the new facets of CBME curriculum in details. GMER 2019, GMER 2023, 3 volumes of the revised UG Curriculum competencies and CISP-LRM documents served as resource materials for the workshop. Interactivity was the key features of all the sessions. The participants also got hands on experience through group / individual tasks linked with the sessions, taking them towards actual implementation of these concepts.

Faculty members conducting the workshop were mainly curriculum committee members as per NMC directives.
